Remove the self-assessment clause for clearing on private land. This has made both farmers and urban residents arrogantly entitled regarding their vegetation. Our local council in Dubbo refuses to introduce a preservation policy for trees on private land, preferring to keep ignorant and unenvironmental residents happy. As a result our urban tree canopy has decreased from 10% to 9% in the last 8 years. This, at a time of climate emergency when our CW. will suffer the highest increase in heat and drought. The State government needs to mandate consistent vegetation laws to protect all trees on private property so that all urban residents have suitable tree canopy and all forests on farmland are maintained.
