Natural Resources Commission

Our role:

Provide credible, independent advice to the NSW Government on managing natural resources in the social, economic and environmental interests of the state.

Functions:

- provide independent advice on natural resource management to the Premier and Ministers
- develop standards and targets for natural resource management in NSW, and oversee their implementation in regional planning
- undertake reviews of plans, audits and inquiries
- help to reconcile complex natural resource management issues.

The NRC undertakes this work using transparent, collaborative approaches



Terms of Reference

- Purpose: to evaluate the effectiveness and efficiency of the current weed management arrangements in NSW, with the view of informing the further development of the NSW Biosecurity Act and other relevant strategies under the NSW Biosecurity Strategy
- Four key lines of inquiry:
 - the distribution and abundance of weeds across NSW and their impact on production and natural assets
 - current regulatory and institutional arrangements
 - weed management activities and funding arrangements
 - viable alternative weed management arrangements
- Focus on barriers, opportunities and best practice
- Covers terrestrial and freshwater weeds on public and private land

Purpose:

Why this review? Why now?

- Weed management consistently raised as an issue during Local Land Service engagement
- Previous reviews
- Recommendations from the DPI Weed Summit (2009)
- Why the NRC?
- Review of biosecurity legislation and the launch of the Biosecurity Strategy



Examples of issues raised in previous reviews

- Funding sources, effectiveness of use
- Effectiveness of awareness programs
- Multiple listing systems
- Efficiency and effectiveness of institutional arrangements
- Research and development what should focus be?
- Compliance / enforcement arrangements and effectiveness
- Consistency of weed management on public/private land

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

Issues Paper

- Purpose: To identify the key issues to be addressed by the review and clarify the scope
 - informed by
 - workshop to be held in September
 - NRC research
 - previous reviews
 - stakeholder input
- Timing:
 - Issues paper will be available for public comment from late October
- The NRC will review all comments to inform the draft report, which will include draft recommendations



Consultation

- Public comment periods
 - approximately six weeks for the Issues Paper
 - four weeks for the draft recommendation report
- Engagement with weed officers and Local Government
 - consultation with Regional Weed Committees, LGNSW, NWAC members
 - NWAC participation in Steering Committee

- Regional tours
 - to include discussions with local weed officers
- Focus group meetings




Draft Report

- Will outline the findings and draft recommendations of the review
- Timing:
 - Issued in late-February
 - Additional consultation / public comments concluding end of March
 - NRC considers feedback April
- Final report to be issued by end-May
